Club Championships

Format

54 Hole Stroke Play held over 3 consecutive Saturdays (18 holes each day).

Handicaps

Competitors will use their Course Handicap as per the 1st round of the Championship for the entirety of the Championship.

Grading

The Championship will be held in 3 Grades based on Course Handicaps as at the 1st day of the Championship.

A Grade – up to 11

B Grade – 12 – 17

C Grade 18 - 36

Eligibility

Categories – 7 day, Life, Corporate, Intermediate 1, Junior

All other categories are ineligible for this event.

Note – Intermediate 2 members are ineligible for this Championship.

Gender - Male

Financial - Players must be financial the beginning and completion of the event to be eligible.

Handicap – Competitors must hold a current Golf Australia Handicap. A player with a handicap history that has less than 10 individual score entries as at the commencement of the 1st round, will be deemed ineligible for this Championship.

Amateur Status

A competitor must hold amateur status. Professionals are not eligible.

Championship Committee

The Championship Committee will comprise of the following individuals:

- Club Captain
- General Manager
- Membership & Development Officer
- Other persons as determined by the Club Captain

The Championship Committee shall have sole management and control of the event. The Championship Committee reserves the right to: (a) fix and/or alter starting times, (b) in the event of bad weather, or for any other reason, either shorten the contest or fix another day/venue, (c) vary any condition should they deem it advisable, (d) reject any entry without assigning any reason therefore. The decision of the Event Committee will be final in all matters and in the absence of a full committee, such members as may be present at the time may give a decision and any decision so given shall be deemed to be a decision of the full Championship Committee.

Entries

Members will enter on to the timesheet for each round. Should a member play in all 3 rounds their aggregate score will be used for the Championship. No other registration is required.

Seeding (Final Round)

- After 36 Holes (2 rounds) competitors will be required to play in a seeded draw as determined by the Championship Committee.
- Seeded players will include:
 - The leading 8 players in A Grade (gross)
 - The leading 4 players in B & C Grade (gross)
- Seeded positions will be determined by use of the Australian Count-back System.
- Seeded positions will be allocated by the Championship Committee and will be between 11am and 12:30pm on the final round.
- Competitors will be advised of their seeded tee time by text message or phone call.
- Should a competitor elect not to play in their allotted seeded tee time they must advise the Golf Club Office. Failure to contest the final round in the seeded section will deem them ineligible for all gross prizes and results.
- Players not seeded for the final round are eligible to win any Championship.

Rules

The Rules of Golf as adopted by the R&A Rules Limited will apply together any supplementary Local Rules as are approved by the Championship Committee

Ball

It will be obligatory for all competitors in all events to play with a ball which is named in the current list of Conforming Golf Balls issued by the R&A. Penalty for breach of this condition: Disqualification.

Transportation

Competitors may ride in motorised transport.

Ties

In the event of a tie for the overall Championship or any Graded Gross Championship, play shall continue hole by hole over such holes as the Championship Committee shall decide, until one player gains at least a one stroke advantage. The breaking of ties for all other events/trophies will be determined by use of the Australian Count-back System.

Note - At the Committee's discretion if a player from outside of the seeded groups is in a tie for any Championship, and a hole by hole playoff at the close of play is not possible, they may elect to schedule an 18 hole playoff on the following Saturday at approximately 12pm.

Protests

Protests must be lodged in writing with the Championship Committee no later than 10 minutes after the conclusion of the day's play except on the final day when they must be lodged no later than 5 minutes after the conclusion of play.

Men's Senior Championship

Format

54 Hole Stroke Play held over 3 consecutive Saturdays (18 holes each day).

Handicaps

Competitors will use their Course Handicap as per the 1st round of the Championship for the entirety of the Championship.

A player with a handicap history that has less than 10 individual score entries as at the 1st round, will be deemed ineligible for this Championship.

Grading

The Championship will be held in one Grade.

Eligibility

A competitor must have reached the age of 55 years as at the 1st day of the Championship.

Categories – 7 day, Life, Corporate

All other categories are ineligible for this event.

Gender - Male

Financial - Players must be financial the beginning and completion of the event to be eligible.

Amateur Status

A competitor must hold amateur status. Professionals are not eligible.

Championship Committee

The Championship Committee will comprise of the following individuals:

- Club Captain
- General Manager
- Membership & Development Officer
- Other persons as determined by the Club Captain

The Championship Committee shall have sole management and control of the event. The Championship Committee reserves the right to: (a) fix and/or alter starting times, (b) in the event of bad weather, or for any other reason, either shorten the contest or fix another day/venue, (c) vary any condition should they deem it advisable, (d) reject any entry without assigning any reason therefore. The decision of the Event Committee will be final in all matters and in the absence of a full committee, such members as may be present at the time may give a decision and any decision so given shall be deemed to be a decision of the full Championship Committee.

Entries

Members will enter on to the timesheet for each round. Should a member play in all 3 rounds their aggregate score will be used for the Championship. No other registration is required.

Seeding (Final Round)

- After 36 Holes (2 rounds) competitors will be required to play in a seeded draw as determined by the Championship Committee.

Note – a player that is seeded within the Club Championship events may choose to play within the seeded section of that draw without forfeiting their eligibility for the Senior Championship. Should a player choose to play within the Senior Championship Seeded section this will not affect their eligibility for the Club Championships.

- The leading 4 players (gross) will be seeded
- Seeded positions will be determined by use of the Australian Count-back System.
- Seeded positions will be allocated by the Championship Committee and will be between 11am and 12:30pm on the final round.
- Competitors will be advised of their seeded tee time by text message or phone call.
- Should a competitor elect not to play in their allotted seeded tee time they must advise the Golf Club Office. Failure to contest the final round in the seeded section will deem them ineligible for all gross prizes and results.
- Players that are not in the seeded section for the final round are still eligible to win any Championship.

Rules

The Rules of Golf as adopted by the R&A Rules Limited will apply together any supplementary Local Rules as are approved by the Championship Committee

Ball

It will be obligatory for all competitors in all events to play with a ball which is named in the current list of Conforming Golf Balls issued by the R&A. Penalty for breach of this condition: Disqualification.

Transportation

Competitors may ride in motorised transport.

Ties

In the event of a tie for the overall Championship, play shall continue hole by hole over such holes as the Championship Committee shall decide, until one player gains at least a one stroke advantage. The breaking of ties for all other events/trophies will be determined by use of the Australian Count-back System.

Note - At the Committee's discretion if a player from outside of the seeded groups is in a tie for any Championship, and a hole by hole playoff at the close of play is not possible, they may elect to schedule an 18 hole playoff on the following Saturday at approximately 12pm.

Protests

Protests must be lodged in writing with the Championship Committee no later than 10 minutes after the conclusion of the day's play except on the final day when they must be lodged no later than 5 minutes after the conclusion of play.

Carbrook Classic

Format

MEN'S CARBROOK CLASSIC – will be played over 36 holes of stroke play on Saturday & Sunday.

WOMEN'S CARBROOK CLASSIC - will be played over 36 holes of stroke play on Saturday & Sunday.

Handicaps

Competitors will use their Course Handicap as per the 1st round of the Classic for the entirety of the event.

Grading

Men's Classic

The Men's Classic will be held in 3 Grades based on Course Handicaps as at the 1st day of the Championship.

A Grade – up to 11

B Grade – 12 – 17

C Grade 18 – 36

Women's Classic

The Women's Classic will have no grades.

Eligibility

The Classic is open to all male and female amateur golfers with a current Golf Australia Handicap. Entries will be on a first in first served basis. Should the number of entries exceed the field capacity a waiting list will be established based on their time of entry.

Visiting golfers must use the official entry form and pay at the time of entry. Members must use the Club's online booking system and pay at registration for the 1st round.

All categories of membership of Carbrook Golf Club are eligible for this event.

Financial - Players must be financial at their respective Club at the beginning and completion of the event to be eligible.

Handicap – Competitors must hold a current Golf Australia Handicap. A player with a handicap history that has less than 10 individual score entries as at the 1st round, will be deemed ineligible for this Championship.

Amateur Status

A competitor must hold amateur status. Professionals are not eligible.

Championship Committee

The Championship Committee will comprise of the following individuals:

- Club Captain
- General Manager
- Membership & Development Officer
- Other persons as determined by the Club Captain

The Championship Committee shall have sole management and control of the event. The Championship Committee reserves the right to: (a) fix and/or alter starting times, (b) in the event of bad weather, or for any other reason, either shorten the contest or fix another day/venue, (c) vary any condition should they deem it advisable, (d) reject any entry without assigning any reason therefore. The decision of the Event Committee will be final in all matters and in the absence of a full

committee, such members as may be present at the time may give a decision and any decision so given shall be deemed to be a decision of the full Championship Committee.

Entries

Members will enter on to the timesheet for each round. Should a member play in both rounds (Saturday & Sunday) their aggregate score will be used for the Championship. No other registration is required.

Seeding (Final Round)

- After 18 Holes competitors will be required to play in a seeded draw as determined by the Championship Committee.
- Seeded players will include:
 - The leading 8 male players (gross ranking)
 - The leading 4 female players (gross ranking)
- Seeded positions will be determined by use of the Australian Count-back System.
- Seeded positions will be allocated by the Championship Committee and will in the 12:00pm field for the final round.
- Competitors will be advised of their seeded tee time by text message, phone call or in person.
- Should a competitor elect not to play in their allotted seeded tee time they must advise the Golf Club Office. Failure to contest the final round in the seeded section will deem them ineligible for all gross prizes and results.
- Players not qualifying for the seeded positions for the final round are still eligible to win any Championship.

Rules

The Rules of Golf as adopted by the R&A Rules Limited will apply together any supplementary Local Rules as are approved by the Championship Committee

Ball

It will be obligatory for all competitors in all events to play with a ball which is named in the current list of Conforming Golf Balls issued by the R&A. Penalty for breach of this condition: Disqualification.

Transportation

Competitors may ride in motorised transport.

Ties

In the event of a tie for the overall Men's or Women's Classic (Gross), play shall continue hole by hole over such holes as the Championship Committee shall decide, until one player gains at least a one stroke advantage. The breaking of ties for all other events/trophies will be determined by use of the Australian Count-back System.

Protests

Protests must be lodged in writing with the Championship Committee no later than 10 minutes after the conclusion of the day's play except on the final day when they must be lodged no later than 5 minutes after the conclusion of play.

Publicity

Carbrook Golf Club arranges publicity before, during and/or after this Championship. It is a condition of entry that all players assent to references to them, and pictures of them in practice and play being published via any medium (including the internet).

Privacy

Carbrook Golf Club may retain the personal details (i.e. name, address, handicap) of entrants in this Championship on its records. Men's and Women's Foursome Championship

Format

27 Hole Foursome Stroke Play held over one Saturday. A Men's and Women's Championship will be held in conjunction.

Handicaps

Competitors will use their Course Handicap on the day of the Championship. A team's handicap will be 50% of the aggregate of the two players. A further 50% of the team's handicap will be used for the final 9 holes.

Grading

The Championship will have no grades except for the division of Men's and Women's Teams.

Eligibility

Teams must comprise two eligible competitors.

Categories – 7 day, Life, Corporate, Intermediate 1, Junior

All other categories are ineligible for this event.

Note – Intermediate 2 members are ineligible for this Championship.

Gender – Male and female individual Championships.

Financial - Players must be financial the beginning and completion of the event to be eligible.

Handicap – Competitors must hold a current Golf Australia Handicap. A player with a handicap history that has less than 10 individual score entries as at the 1st round, will be deemed ineligible for this Championship.

Amateur Status

A competitor must hold amateur status. Professionals are not eligible.

Championship Committee

Categories – 7 day, 6 day, Life, Corporate, Intermediate 1, Junior

All other categories are ineligible for this event.

Note – Intermediate 2 members are ineligible for this Championship.

Gender – One male and one female will make up each team.

Financial - Players must be financial the beginning and completion of the event to be eligible.

Handicap – Competitors must hold a current Golf Australia Handicap. A player with a handicap history that has less than 10 individual score entries as at the 1st round, will be deemed ineligible for this Championship.

Amateur Status

A competitor must hold amateur status. Professionals are not eligible.

Championship Committee

The Championship Committee will comprise of the following individuals:

- Club Captain
- General Manager
- Membership & Development Officer
- Other persons as determined by the Club Captain

The Championship Committee shall have sole management and control of the event. Four-Ball Stroke Play Championship

Format

36 Hole Four-Ball Stroke Play held over two consecutive Saturdays.

Handicaps

Competitors will use their Course Handicap on the first day of the Championship.

Grading

The Championship will be held in 1 Grade based on Course Handicaps as at the 1st day of the Championship.

Eligibility

Teams must comprise two eligible competitors.

Categories – 7 day, Life, Corporate, Intermediate 1, Junior

All other categories are ineligible for this event.

Note – Intermediate 2 members are ineligible for this Championship.

Gender – Teams can comprise any combination of male and female players.

Financial - Players must be financial the beginning and completion of the event to be eligible.

Handicap – Competitors must hold a current Golf Australia Handicap. A player with a handicap history that has less than 10 individual score entries as at the 1st round, will be deemed ineligible for this Championship.

Amateur Status

A competitor must hold amateur status. Professionals are not eligible.

Championship Committee

Four-Ball Match Play Championship

Format

Four-Ball Match Play with the benefit of handicap.

Handicaps

Competitors will use their Course Handicap as at the start of the day on each round of the Championship. The lowest handicap player in the group will revert to scratch and $\frac{3}{4}$ of the difference (rounded to the nearest whole number) will be applied to the other players. The Match Index will be used for the distribution of the strokes through the round.

Grading

No Grades

Eligibility

Teams must comprise two eligible competitors.

Categories – 7 day, Life, Corporate, Intermediate 1, Junior

All other categories are ineligible for this event.

Note – Intermediate 2 members are ineligible for this Championship.

Gender – Teams can comprise any combination of male and female players. Men will play from the Blue Tees and women will play from the Red tees.

Financial - Players must be financial the beginning and completion of the event to be eligible.

Handicap – Competitors must hold a current Golf Australia Handicap. A player with a handicap history that has less than 10 individual score entries as at the 1st round, will be deemed ineligible for this Championship.

Amateur Status

A competitor must hold amateur status. Professionals are not eligible.

Championship Committee

The Championship Committee will comprise of the following individuals:

- Club Captain
- General Manager
- Membership & Development Officer
- Other persons as determined by the Club Captain

The Championship Committee shall have sole management and control of the event. The Championship Committee reserves the right to: (a) fix and/or alter starting times, (b) in the event of bad weather, or for any other reason, either shorten the contest or fix another day/venue, (c) vary any condition should they deem it advisable, (d) reject any entry without assigning any reason therefore. The decision of the Event Committee will be final in all matters and in the absence of a full committee, such members as may be present at the time may give a decision and any decision so given shall be deemed to be a decision of the full Championship Committee.

Entries

Members will register their teams through the online entry process provided. An entry fee will apply for this event payable at registration for the first round. In the event of a bye the team will pay their entry prior to the second round.

Draw

A random draw for the event will be completed within 7 days of the closing of entries based upon the number of entries received. Where there are a number of entries that does not create all matches for the first round, byes will be issued on a random basis.

The draw will be available on the members portal throughout the event.

Matches

Each match will take place within the two week period allocated by the Committee. Players may agree on a suitable time and day to play. Should agreement not be reached, the match will be played on the last Saturday of the allocated period between the time of 11:45am – 12:15pm.

Players **will not** be able to play in a Stroke Play event in conjunction with the Match.

Ties

In the event of a tie after 18 holes the Match will continue in the same order of holes as per the first 18 holes until a hole is won. Handicap strokes will be taken in the same manner as the first 18 holes.

Rules

The Rules of Golf as adopted by the R&A Rules Limited will apply together any supplementary Local Rules as are approved by the Championship Committee

Ball

It will be obligatory for all competitors in all events to play with a ball which is named in the current list of Conforming Golf Balls issued by the R&A. Penalty for breach of this condition: Disqualification.

Transportation

Competitors may ride in motorised transport.

Protests

Protests must be lodged in writing with the Championship Committee no later than 10 minutes after the conclusion of the day's play except on the final day when they must be lodged no later than 5 minutes after the conclusion of play.

Entry Fee

An entry fee of \$15 per person will be charged for entry into this event. This will be payable at registration for the first round. Should a team have a bye on the first round they will pay the fee prior to their second round.

Prizes
